Items available to swap or buy for £1 include books, clothes, shoes, DVDs, unused toiletries and bags. Erin Finlayson and Megan MacDougall are doing a wonderful job running the shop as part of their charities group work. Money raised from swap shop goes back into swap shop, buying items from a range of different charity shops.'

- 1. This web form is the easiest and most thorough way for one person to feed-back the points raised by their group's discussion. The form also offers you the chance to upload anything that might help describe the content of your group's discussions (e.g. videos, photos, mind maps, drawings etc). online feedback form.
