
You may be aware that there are going to be some changes to qualifications and assessment in Scotland. This newsletter contains a link to further information about these reforms.

### **SCIENCE**




The first year students have successfully completed a range of tasks in order to obtain their "Bunsen Burner Licence".

They have been following the lab safety rules and learnt how to set up their laboratory space safely, so that they can conduct

practical experiments.
